#### **POLICY**

### **Definitions**

Chief Officer – The Transit Police Chief Officer or delegate.

<u>Police Act</u> – The BC *Police Act*, RSBC 1996, c. 367, and the regulations thereto, including the Transit Police Operations Regulation, all as amended from time to time.

<u>Transit Police</u> – The South Coast British Columbia Transportation Authority Police Service.

<u>Transit Police Personnel</u> – Sworn police officers and civilians who work for the Transit Police.

<u>TSML</u> – The TransLink Security Management Limited, a subsidiary of the South Coast British Columbia Transportation Authority and legal entity/employer for the Transit Police.

## **Authority**

1. The Transit Police is a Designated Policing Unit in British Columbia established pursuant to s. 4.1 of the *Police Act* upon application made by the SCBCTA. Pursuant to the application approval, the Transit Police is a part of the TSML and all Transit Police Personnel are employees of the TSML.

#### General

- Transit Police Personnel will have access to training programs and development opportunities and be primarily responsible for planning and managing their own career development.
- 3. In support of career development, the Transit Police, in concert with the TSML, will provide a career development program that:

Career Development AB110

1. will assist personnel in planning and managing their career development;

- 2. is voluntary;
- 3. ensures that all personnel have access to training and development opportunities;
- 4. is administered by a Deputy Chief Officer Support Services under the Chief Officer, in consultation with the TSML as appropriate; and
- 5. is evaluated annually and kept current as required.
- 4. In support of personnel career development, the Transit Police will develop and maintain a current inventory of the skills, knowledge and abilities of Transit Police Personnel.
- 5. Transit Police Personnel can obtain information on the career development program and training and development opportunities through the Transit Police Training Section, or as otherwise instructed by the Chief Officer.
