

Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act Request:

Transit Police Overtime

Since 2006 the Transit Police have come in under budget on overtime, every year.

- Overtime costs for 2010, after reimbursement by VANOC for the Olympic Games overtime costs, was \$635,000
- Many of our overtime hours are spent providing a safe environment for transit customers during events (like hockey and football games, concerts or the Celebration of Lights)
- 20% reduction in overtime related to court appearances from 2006 to 2011
- Recent steps have been taken to further reduce overtime costs by adjusting minimum staffing levels and improving the leave sign up process

2010 Winter Olympic 1,009,706 OT costs recovered from the Federal Gov't Overtime spend was only 1,645,382 - 1,009,706 = 635,676 on a 1,334,790 buget or an underspend of 699,114

Approx half of OT is related to meeting minimum staffing requirements on the line as a result of sworn members being off on leave, sick, injured, vacancies.

About 20% of OT is due to extension of shifts

Approx 15% of OT is for officers attending court

About 10 % of OT is additional staffing required for special events such as Celebration of lights, concerts, sporting events
