POLICY

Definitions

<u>BCPPS</u> – The British Columbia Provincial Policing Standards issued pursuant to the *Police Act*, as amended from time to time.

<u>Criminal Code</u> – The Criminal Code, RSC 1985, c. C-46, as amended from time to time.

<u>FOIPPA</u> – The BC Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, RSBC 1996, c. 165, as amended from time to time.

<u>IMF</u> – Intelligence Management Framework of the Transit Police as so determined by the Chief Officer, and amended from time to time.

<u>Intelligence</u> – Intelligence is information (raw data of any type) which has been worked on, given added value or significance and been evaluated in context to its source and reliability. Intelligence analysis is about the collecting and utilizing of information, evaluating it to process it into intelligence, and then analyzing that intelligence to produce products to support informed decision making.

<u>JPD</u> – Jurisdictional Police Department.

<u>Member</u> – Designated Constable (all ranks), the Chief Officer or a Deputy Chief Officer of the Transit Police.

<u>Police Act</u> – The *BC Police Act*, RSBC 1996, c. 367, and the regulations thereto, including the *South Coast British Columbia Transportation Authority Police Service Operations Regulation*, all as amended from time to time.

<u>Transit Police</u> – The South Coast British Columbia Transportation Authority Police Service Designated Policing Unit.

Authority

1. Members are authorized to conduct intelligence activities in the lawful execution of their duties.


General

- Pursuant to BCPPS Addendum 1 D4, Transit Police will maintain an intelligence function to provide criminal information and intelligence for the detection and prevention of crime and other such activities

- 4. As a Designated Policing Unit in British Columbia, Transit Police intelligence management will be conducted in a manner consistent with the Memorandum of Understanding between the Transit Police and Jurisdictional Police in the Transportation Service Region.


